Greetings in the Lord,

When I was a boy, I was told, "Baptists don't do Lent." No one knew why. I suspect that it was an anti-Catholic thing. It was the old argument, "whatever they do, we don't!"—a curiously convoluted and unhealthy way to decide on spiritual disciplines and practices.

Whatever the reason for "not doing Lent," I think it is a great loss for any Christian not to prepare for Good Friday and Easter. Every spring pro baseball players prepare for the season with spring training and every spring ordinary people prepare for summer by doing "spring cleaning." So why shouldn't Christians prepare for the most important events in Jesus' ministry—what he did for us on Good Friday and Easter Sunday, what he did for us on Golgotha's cross and at the empty tomb? If it helps, think of Lent as a kind of Christian spring training or spring cleaning.

To help with this, we will be providing lots of Lenten opportunities during the month of March. I will be preaching a sermon series entitled, "On the Road with Jesus." In these sermons we will take our Lenten journey together with Jesus on some of the roads that he walked leading to his crucifixion on Good Friday and to his resurrection on Easter Sunday morning. Also, we will be holding our Easter musical, "This is Why We Believe."

Matthew 24: 4 – 8 Jesus answered: “Watch out that no one deceives you. For many will come in my name, claiming, ‘I am the Messiah,’ and will deceive many. You will hear of wars and rumors of wars, but see to it that you are not alarmed. Such things must happen, but the end is still to come. Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom. There will be famines and earthquakes in various places. All these are the beginning of birth pains.” (NIV)

Jesus is at the end of His three-year ministry, and He has some final instructions for His disciples. They ask Him when the Temple He spoke of will be brought down. Basically, when will He come in power and overthrow those who are in control? He answers that it will be after He leaves them. Why else would someone claim to be Him? There would be some terrible things to come, like wars and one nation overthrowing another nation. In an earlier chapter, Jesus said that brother would turn against brother, daughter-in-law will turn against mother-in-law, and so on. Read the rest of this chapter; it's serious business about what it will look like before the end. You think it's bad now?!

Look at this last sentence, “All these are the beginning of birth pains.” The beginning? Wow! For those of you who have given birth, and those of you who have been present at that time, it is painful...really painful. (Thank you, ladies, I am totally good with being a male.) And, you don't know when it will end. It could be a very short labor (just ask the Schulers). Or it could take a couple of days, (ask everyone else). So once the pains begin, that is when we will start to see calamities and devastation. That is not the end; that is just the beginning. Will it only last a few hours, a day? Is it just an allusion that, when it starts, we will have no way of knowing when it will stop or how bad it will get?

The one thing I take as a positive from this is, when it ends, there will be something new

born into creation. This is something beautiful that we will cherish more than we can possibly imagine. Isn't that how it is with a newborn? We are wrapped up in “awe” and majesty that God has created this tiny, little baby and given the child to us! Mere humans! How could He? Doesn't He know that we will mess up and make mistakes? Sure He does. Still, He loves us so much that He is willing to accept us, flaws and all, because we serve a Risen Savior, Jesus.

When we come to Holy Week and Easter Sunday, remember that there will be strife in your life, tears will be shed, and pain will be felt. Unfortunately, this is life. We will have broken hearts, financial strains, torn ligaments, and shattered bones, but we will survive it all and end up amazed at the majesty He has planned to place before us. When you come to worship Him, do so because He deserves it, and we should be thankful.





The Giving Spirit mission is an opportunity for us to support others in a time of need.



Spring Forward, Review Safety Checklist

Time to Change the Clock

Daylight Saving Time begins every year on the second Sunday in March. Clocks are set forward one hour, except in Hawaii and most of Arizona. Daylight saving time begins Sunday, March 11, 2018.

It's also a good time to review the following spring safety checklist:



Smoke Alarms

Three out of every five home fire deaths result from fires in homes with no smoke alarms, according to the National Fire Protection Association. Test your smoke alarms every month and replace the battery at least once a year. If the alarm makes a "chirping" sound, replace it immediately. Smoke alarms should be in every bedroom and in the common areas on each floor of a home. Mount them at least 10 feet from the stove to reduce false alarms, less than 12 inches from the ceiling, and away from windows, doors and ducts.



Smoke alarms can be interconnected wirelessly. That means, when one sounds, they all sound. A Consumer Product Safety Commission survey found this is the best way to notify everyone in a home if there is a fire. Be sure to purchase smoke alarms with the label of a reputable testing agency, like Underwriters Laboratories (UL).

Carbon Monoxide Detectors

Anything that burns fuel can potentially become a source of carbon monoxide, an invisible, odorless gas that can kill. CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each bedroom and on every level of the home. The safety tips for CO detectors mirror those of smoke alarms: change the batteries, test them, and interconnect them, if possible. Also, make sure vents for your gas appliances (e.g., fireplace, dryer, stove and furnace) are free and clear of snow or debris.

BULLETINS & INSERTS

1. Due to the space restriction of the bulletin, we strongly advise all Committee & Team Chairs to plan their communication strategy several weeks in advance—especially if your promotional item will also require a place on the website or in Chimes.
2. Bulletin notices should be kept short with the intent to move readers to our online presence to learn more about events, upcoming Bible studies, service opportunities, registration, etc.
3. Bulletin notices must be brief and to the point. Please limit it to a headline and 3-to-5 sentences, including contact information. If you need more space, please contact the church secretary to discuss other communication options.
4. Bulletin inserts must fit on a 5.5" x 8.5" sheet of paper, single-sided (half page for letter-sized piece of paper). If your submission requires a lot of text, please consider putting that text in the monthly Chimes newsletter and/or on the BUMC website and using a notice or insert as a teaser to move people to the website. Please contact the Web Editor if you have any questions.
5. Minister and staff bulletin submissions take first priority.
6. Art work in the body of the bulletin notice is not allowed. Due to the severe space restrictions in the bulletin and the importance of keeping the text at a size that can be easily read by everyone, we cannot use artwork or graphics in the bulletin. Art work is encouraged for both Chimes and the BUMC website and should be emailed to those editors.
7. Deadline for bulletin submissions is Tuesday at 2pm. All submissions must be done in writing either by email to info@bumcinfo.org or drop it off at the church office. Due to quality control concerns, submissions are not taken over the phone. If you wish to design your own insert, please speak to the church office prior to doing so.
8. Bulletins are posted on the BUMC website each week. Bulletin inserts are not posted to the web.

WEBSITE and SOCIAL MEDIA

1. Deadline for general website submissions or changes are Tuesday of every week. Please send your submissions of text, graphics, photos, and/or videos by email to webeditorbumc@gmail.com
2. Most website requests can be fulfilled that same week (if not that same day); however, some requests may take more time or may involve more people. If your request is a bit complex or has a lot of text and/or images please contact the web editor to discuss your communication needs.
3. Photos of children should be group photos only, never individual photos. Names will never be attached or tagged to any photo of any children. Individual photos of children will be taken off the BUMC Facebook. See the BUMC Photograph Privacy policy.
4. If you have an announcement, a request, event photos or video, etc. that you would like to promote on the BUMC Facebook page, please contact webeditorbumc@gmail.com Members may certainly post to our Facebook group but if an admin person updates the page it will appear on the News Feed for everyone who has "liked" us.

1. Submissions are made via email to chimeseditorbumc@gmail.com or via hard copy in the Chimes Editor mail slot in the former office area of the church.

2. Deadlines appear on the church calendar and in the bulletin but are generally the 15th of the month. Late submissions may not be included, as we will not postpone the distribution deadline.
3. Every area of ministry/committee needs to identify the person responsible for submitting information to the Chimes Editor.
4. Chimes is emailed in color to the subscription list during the last week of each month. Chimes is also available in black and white print format on the Welcome Center at the beginning of each month.
5. Photos of adult faces are permitted, however children's faces are not permitted unless the Chimes Editor is given explicit written permission by their parent(s). Group pictures of events should be identified by name of event and date. See the BUMC Photograph Privacy policy.

ACTIVITY/EVENT REGISTRATION SOFTWARE

1. Google Forms should be used to allow members to sign up or register for events online.
2. Printed or in person registration should be used to allow members to sign up or register for events.

PERSONAL FACEBOOK and SOCIAL MEDIA

1. Personal Facebook posts: Often during major events, church members will post pictures that they have personally taken that will include children. Please don't tag or name any of these children in your personal Facebook. Try to post only group pictures of children.

CALENDAR

1. All calendar requests should be emailed to the church secretary at info@bumcinfo.org or by phone contact to 513.734.7201. All specific room requests must be made at the time of posting the event if possible.

CHURCH SERVICE ANNOUNCEMENTS

1. Deadline for slide requests is Tuesday by 2pm. All submissions run on a first-come, first serve basis. Submissions must be done in-writing and they must be brief. The more words that you try to put on a slide the more difficult it will be to read. Please email your request to info@bumcinfo.org

CHURCH SERVICE VIDEOS

1. All videos that will be played during a church service or event must be approved by a Pastor or Staff member.

CHURCH SIGN

1. The outside church sign is changed every week by the designated Signmaster. If you would like something posted on the sign, it must be approved by the BUMC staff.
2. We cannot post information or promote any 'for-profit' organizations or political groups.

WELCOME CENTER

1. The Welcome Center has very specific items on display and only those items may be placed on the table at any time. If you have some literature that you would like to make available to the congregation, please check with the church office before placing those items.
2. We cannot distribute or promote any 'for-profit' organizations or political groups.

1. Do not alter the design of the church logo. That includes changing the fonts, colors or graphics. If you need a digital copy of the logo, please contact the church secretary by email.


