Greetings in the Lord,

August is upon us and children everywhere are growing increasingly forlorn as they get ready to return to school. With the possible exception of school teachers, most parents are looking at back-to-school with an attitude similar to a Staples TV commercial from a few years ago, where a father enters an office supply store with his two children to do some school supply shopping. The two little ones look very sad as school approaches, while the father is dancing and singing to the tune, "It's the most wonderful time of the year."

I seem to be feeling a little nostalgic as kids head back to school this year. Maybe it's because I just realized I'm not middle-aged anymore, unless of course I live to be 122. Or maybe it's because this time of the year with kids returning to school reminds me of my younger days. For whatever reason, I have taken to writing my own memoirs for my adult children. I hope you will indulge me as I share an excerpt from that work-in-progress:

"When I was four years old, we moved to Milford, Ohio for the nicer neighborhood and for me to start kindergarten in a better school system. The elementary school I attended, Milford South, was about a half mile away. I walked to

and from school each day, rain or shine. One of the most embarrassing moments of my life required my mom picking me up from school early one day. I was unable to hold my bladder until the end of class that day and accidentally wet myself right there at my desk in front of God and all my classmates. They all laughed even though I counted at least a half dozen or more of them that experienced similar accidents that school year."

Despite that early memory, I look back fondly on my younger days attending school. In fact, as summer draws to a close and as students prepare to return to school, I find myself thinking in terms of back-to-school matters myself. Even though I've been out of school for many years, there's something exhilarating about the start of a new school year. The fact of the matter is we never really stop learning. Whether I'm trying to figure all the nuances of features on my laptop or simply trying to learn how to better live out my faith, I'm thankful for the opportunities to learn.

As disciples of Jesus Christ, we will never fully understand everything there is to know about the Christian life. But, we should not let that discourage us. Rather, we should let it inspire and challenge us







Back to School Safety Checklist



As summer draws to a close and children start heading back to school, family life can get pretty hectic. It's important to remember – and share with your children – some key tips that will help keep them safe and healthy throughout the school year.

Getting to School

Whether children walk, ride their bicycle or take the bus to school, it is vitally important that they – and the motorists around them – take proper safety precautions.

Walkers



 Walk on the sidewalk; if there is no sidewalk and you must walk in the street, walk facing traffic.

- Before crossing the street, stop and look left, right and left again to see if cars are coming.
- Never dart out in front of a parked car.
- Parents: Practice walking to school with your child, crossing streets at crosswalks when available.
- Never walk while texting or talking on the phone.
- Do not walk while using headphones.

Bike Riders

 Always wear a helmet that is <u>fitted and</u> <u>secured properly</u>.



 Children need to know the rules of

the road: ride single file on the right side of the road, come to a complete stop before crossing the street and walk the bike across.

- Watch for opening car doors and other hazards.
- Use hand signals when turning.
- Wear bright-colored clothing

Bus Riders



- Teach children the proper way to get on and off the bus.
- Line up six feet away
 from the curb as the bus

approaches.

- If seat belts are available, buckle up.
- Wait for the bus to stop completely before standing.
- Do not cross in front of the bus if possible, or walk at least 10 feet ahead until you can see the other drivers.

Drivers, Share the Road

- Don't block crosswalks.
- Yield to pedestrians in crosswalks, and take extra care in school zones.

- Never pass a vehicle stopped for pedestrians.
- Never pass a bus loading or unloading children.
- The area 10 feet around a school bus is the most dangerous for children; stop far enough back to allow them to safely enter and exit the bus.

Teen Drivers



Teens crash most often because they are inexperienced. They struggle judging gaps in traffic, driving the right speed for conditions and turning safely, among other things. As your teen becomes a new driver, learn about what you can do as a parent to keep them safe.

Prevent Injuries at School

Following are more discussion topics for parents of school-age children:

- Backpack safety
- Playground safety
- Head up, phone down
- Concussion risk from sports





ALARM SYSTEM UPDATE

The BUMC alarm installation is due to start on July 26 and will be completed near the first day of August. Everyone who has a key to the church MUST contact Dawn Herbolt and give her your personal four digit code you want to use. If you no longer need a key, then please drop them off to Dawn at your earliest convenience. Once the alarm system is active, you will need your four digit code to turn the alarm off when you enter the building with your key. Upon leaving you will again punch in your four digit code to reset the alarm, providing no one else is in the building, of course!

and how to use it, the Safety Committee is holding an orientation on Sunday, July 29, immediately after the 2nd service in the sanctuary. Although it is not difficult, you may want to attend if you need to keep your key so that you can enter when the church alarm is set. Once the new alarm system is active, it will no longer be automatically set at 10:00 p.m. and off at 6:00 a.m. The alarm will be set whenever the church is empty.
